I was a member of the Horizon Wylfa Newydd stakeholder group and regularly attended those meetings the group has now sadly disbanded.

I take an active interest in all aspects of the constituency life and am always willing to meet formally or informally with the electors to discuss any issues of concern for example littering, waste, dog fouling, planning and highways issues, flooding, rights of way amenities, etc. and am always available to be contacted by phone, by email or face to face. I try to resolve issues myself or referring issues to the appropriate department on behalf of the electors and I am very grateful to the Council Officers for the help and support in addressing and resolving issues.

I am still involved in community clean-ups and applaud the community spirit in particular work done to improve the appearance of the village, cutting vegetation, litter picking, planting, etc. and this is an excellent way to bring the community together to achieve something positive.

I'm very grateful that I was re-elected to represent the Cybi ward in May 2017. It is a great honour for me to represent this very special area and I do my very best to represent the whole area from Rhoscolyn to Mynydd Tŵr Including urban areas Kingsland ,Maeshyfryd and Tresefion.

The area is very geographically varied and has some very prosperous parts but I also represent some of the poorest most deprived communities in Wales.

After my election I was fortunate enough to have been given a post on the cabinet responsible for Corporate matters and this has given me an opportunity to learn how complex the Council is and how the democratic process works.

We as a Council are facing huge challenges in all fields but particularly in Social Services, Children and Adult Services, in Education and are striving to improve educational standards and to bring in reform and introduce 21st-century schools.

There are many other challenges against the background of the greatest of austerity in living memory.

I am of course very interested in the economic development of Ynys Môn and Ynys Gybi.

I recognise the importance of tourism to our economy and issues such as the National Grid pylons, Orthios and developments at the Anglesey Aluminium site, the port of Holyhead, Bluestone and the Morlais development on an off shore. The Wylfa site.

We have a very unique land and seascape here on Ynys Gybi and indeed the whole of Ynys Môn and I'm very keen to protect and enhance our environment.

I have worked with Surfers Against Sewage, the Council and the community to promote the reduction, the re-use and recycling of plastic. I am very proud that Anglesey Council was the first Authority in the UK to gain the plastic free status. Of course more work needs to be done in this area and to improve our waste recycling rates.

A major perhaps, the major challenge for us all is climate change and I will do my best as an individual and a County Councillor to ensure we do everything possible as an authority to become greener and protect our very precious environment.
