## 1 - Role & Responsibilities

I was Leader of the Council and Portfolio Holder for Major Developments during the year.

I am a member of the Isle of Anglesey Charitable Trust and attended 3 meetings (75%). I am also a member of the Trust's Regeneration Committee.

I was a member of the Joint Local Services Board (Anglesey and Gwynedd) and the Voluntary Sector Liaison Committee. The work of the Local Services Board is to prepare for compliance with the Wellbeing of Future Generations Act.

I was a member of the Fostering Panel for the past twelve months. The panel is made up of lay members as well as social workers and a representative from the Health Trust specialising in paediatric health.

The authority has various boards that oversee the development projects the Council is working on. In my role as Leader I attended most of these. They are listed below:

I am Chairman of the Board of Governors of Ysgol Goronwy Owen and I am also a member of the Board of Governors of Ysgol Syr Thomas Jones.

I have been constantly campaigning with the No Pylons group.
